# 7. <u>Business Without Notice</u>

#### i) Service Club Welcome Signs

George Young read a poem "Ode to Service Clubs Welcome Signs" (attached). He asked what Council was going to do about the welcome signs for services clubs as these signs represented recognition to services clubs.

George expressed it was his understanding that the signs were to be replaced. This is not the understanding of the Council representatives present and clarification will be provided to George.

# ii) Cliff Burvill Pathway

David Humphrey congratulated Council on the repairs on the pathway and asked if further works were proposed.

John Truman advised that the work required to repair the damage by the contractor had been finished to Council's satisfaction and that the remainder of the path would be repaired as required within Council's maintenance program.

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# iii) Closed Path - Ballina Heights

David Humphrey asked when the developers would be carrying out the repairs on the path.

John Truman advised he would contact the developers and provide a response.

## iv) Ballina Heights Drive Opening Date

David Humphrey asked about the opening date for Ballina Heights Drive.

John Truman advised that Council had completed the required assessment for the subdivision certificates and these have been issued. It was now the developer's responsibility to finalise an outstanding s88b instrument and lodge the plan for registration. Following lodgement, the registration process is expected to take 3-4 weeks.

# v) <u>Ballina Heights Drive – Full Interchange</u>

David Humphrey asked whether there was an opportunity for a full interchange with Ballina Heights Drive.

John Truman advised the Council supported this project and had taken up a number of opportunities to lobby the State Government to provide this upgrade. The upgrade is not currently provided in any of Council's strategic plans, however this will be reviewed during the current update to the Council's s94 Roads Contribution Plan.

#### vi) Surveys on Rate Increases

Cr Johnson asked for an update on the workshop that was held the day before regarding the survey results for the special rate increases proposed for the pools.

John Truman advised that a report on the telephone survey results and the submissions received regarding the pools would be reported to Council in November.

# vii) <u>Intersection of Compton Drive & Hill Street</u>

# Lighting on South side of Ferry

David discussed an option of changing the boomgate at the ferry to gain more power so that it could be used to install more lighting on the south side of the ferry.

### Turning Circle – Southside of Ferry

David asked could he get a response to his correspondence regarding this matter.

John Truman to provide a response.

#### Request for Parabolic Mirrors

David asked if parabolic mirrors could be installed so the ferry driver can see around the corner of the road on the south side.

# Use of Box Trailers on Ferry

David advised that we was promised he could be part of the budget meetings for the ferry and he had written a letter to which he never received a response. He requested concessional arrangements for residents who used box trailers on the ferry.

# xxi) Ferry Slippage to Swan Bay

John Truman advised that the procurement was done under a competitive assessment process and the best value for money and most suitable site was the Swan Bay location

John Truman advised that the annual maintenance was more cost effective and met licence requirements.

#### xxiii) Boat Ramp Application

David asked about the boat ramp for Keith Hall.

John Truman advised he would confirm details of a recent grant for this project.

John Truman advised that the Council did not expect to change the hull at any stage, subject to the continued maintenance program. Other parts of the Ferry are replaced on a scheduled basis.



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# REPORT FOR A WARD COMMITTEE MEETING - BALLINA COASTAL COUNTRY MUSIC FESTIVAL 2014

- Thank you to Council for financial support of 2014 Festival and especially thank them for the
  early commitment of ongoing financial support for next year. Without this support the
  Festival, which is focused on free family entertainment, probably couldn't continue.
- The Festival is in need of more private sponsorship always hard to secure. Budget runs just below \$100,000 yearly.
- I am yet to see financial statement, but understand we broke even.
- Survey conducted on our behalf by Rotaract Club of Ballina on Richmond surveyed almost 200 people with 82 from postcodes outside Ballina Shire boundary, many from SE Queensland.
- No criticisms received at all with comprehensively positive comments/suggestions.
   Such as:
  - More buskers with more distance between each
  - Need more kid's entertainment
  - Great for local businesses
  - More water availability water stations supplied
  - Great vibe, atmosphere, Close River Street for two days with more acts
  - Bigger acts
  - Wonderful family day
  - More seating and shade please
  - Great to see Ballina come alive
  - Keep it happening ,( with many more too numerous to list)
- AGM is yet to be held. Date will be fixed for December. Our financial year is 1<sup>st</sup> January to 30<sup>th</sup> November to encompass full festival financial year. Financial Statements, Balance Sheet, Profit & Loss etc. provided at AGM and then lodged with Department of Free Trading in accordance with not-for-profit entities under the Incorporated Associations Act
- A great need remains for more people willing to commit to the promotion and running of the Festival.
- Festival is/has been run solely by unpaid volunteers. Monthly meetings held up are until closer to the Festival then bi-monthly then weekly up until commencement of Festival.
- Carol Stacey our President/Organiser for the past four years is tiring. Considerable support this year of Vice-President Garry Lavercombe should be noted.
- We have Council support but without people on the ground the Festival just can't survive.
- Festival has untapped potential which would, without doubt, provide greater community benefit financially, culturally and spiritually.
