KINGS PARK VISION

The Overall Vision

The overall concept for Kings Park is inspired by the breathtaking coastal outlook, environmental sustainability and water recycling.

Central to the suburban areas of Lennox Head, the Park has historically provided an open green space for informal use by local residents. With the recent addition of the reservoir to the Park this open space remains a key part of the landscape and is complemented by the addition of a cross-generational playspace and general picnic facilities to support the recreational needs of the local community.

The theme of the playspace is water (we can see it, we can use it, we can recycle it and we can play in it). The playspace will promote imaginative, and creative play by offering a diversity of water play experiences suitable for all abilities and ages. The playspace splashpad that will be a hit with the kids (big and small)! A place to get wet and have a ball!

A variety of water play equipment such as upturning round buckets, misting rings and water jets that squirt randomly throughout the playspace, will all occur on a splashpad with no standing water.

The splashpad will be ideally located with access to BBQ's at the reservoir and proximate to the open grassy area so that children using many parts of the Park can be easily supervised.

This concept has been prepared in consultation with the Lennox Head Resident's Association and Kings Court Reserve Protection Group.

Playspace Objectives


- Maintain a functional open grassy area within Kings Park for general recreation purposes.
- Create a stimulating and interesting playspace for children aged 2 10 years old and suitable for all abilities, using water as the key design element
- Provide seating areas for parents to provide appropriate supervision.
- Integrate age appropriate educational messages about recycling water
- · Incorporate picnic facilities within a shaded setting.
- · Connect to the future cycleway/shared pathway on North Creek Road.

Reservoir Precinct Objectives

- Maximise opportunities to enjoy the ocean outlook.
- Make use of the covered area offered by the reservoir to provide BBQ • facilities.
- Provide recommendations for embellishing the concrete reservoir structure and surrounds including incorporation of artwork and recycled timbers from the old Teven bridges.
- Integrate interpretative signage that provides information about water • recycling or the Kings Court Reserve Reservoir facility specifically.

DESIGN PRINCIPLES

- The following design principles underpin the concept:
- maximise views towards the ocean
- consider views from adjoining residences
- provide some opportunities for cross-generational and all-ability play
- is open and adaptable
- is a focal point of the local community
- is safe and is perceived to be safe
- has good surveillance
- is easily maintained



- is a place where children can be and feel fair, included, smart, independent, safe, active, and comfortable during play
- provides wet and dry play settings and a diversity of play experiences by including surfaces, textures and planting in a combination of 'natural' and more orderly arrangements



Thank you for this opportunity to provide input into the proposed embellishment of the Kings Court Reserve Recycled Water infrastructure.

This submission is presented by the membership of the Kings Court Reserve Protection Group (KCRPG) consisting of approximately 80 local residents – the majority of whom reside in close proximity to the structure.

The significant majority of KCRPG member's responses to the Vision and Concept Plan currently on Public Exhibition were that the 'Playground Equipment' currently offered in the Plan as an extra option to include (at the expense of other playground equipment in Victor Park) should be a mandatory inclusion in the design.

This position is in line with all previous correspondence between Council and the KCRPG, the Lennox Head Resident's Association and the Lennox Head Chamber of Commerce.

Below is an excerpt of previous correspondence from the Group to Council dated 15 December 2009.

At the KCRPG meeting of 15 December 2009 it was resolved that: <u>the KCRPG endorses the</u> concept plans for delivering recycled water with a pressure system incorporating a 107kL feeder tank located at the southern end of Kings Court Reserve PROVIDED that the embellishment of the reserve is undertaken ie landscaping, BBQs, tables and seating, playground equipment, rebound wall, toilets, etc, as outlined in your draft report.

Attached is my presentation proposal for the Kings Court Reserve.






