DA 2014/387: Advice on validity of conditions of consent requiring the indemnification of Ballina Shire Council

Question

Ballina Shire Council (**Council**) issued a notice of determination of development application, which granted consent to a development application lodged by Visionstream Pty Ltd (**Visionstream**) on behalf of NBN Co Limited (**nbn**) for the erection of a telecommunications facility comprising a 45m high lattice tower (**Tower**) and ancillary equipment, being DA 2014/387 (**DA**).

Deferred commencement condition 1 of the DA requires the demonstration that nbn can legally indemnify Council and the Ballina Byron Gateway Airport (**Airport**) in perpetuity from liabilities concerning the Tower's intrusion through the Airport's obstacle limitation surface (**Deferred Commencement Condition**).

Condition 9 of the DA then requires Visionstream and nbn to legally indemnify Council and the Airport as contemplated by the Deferred Commencement Condition (**DA Condition**).

You have asked us to advise on:

- the lawfulness of the Deferred Commencement Condition and the DA Condition (together, Indemnity Conditions); and
- (b) whether the Indemnity Conditions are severable from the DA and should be removed by way of a modification application under section 96 (Modification Application) of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 (EPA Act).

Answer

- (a) The Indemnity Conditions are unlawful. The Land and Environment Court (Court) has made it clear, in Galandon Pty Ltd v Narrabri Shire Council (1983) 51 LGRA 5 (Galandon) and Hutchison 3G Australia Pty Ltd v Waverley Council [2002] NSWLEC 151 (Hutchison), that the requirement to indemnify a consent authority in a condition of development consent does not fulfil a valid planning purpose and is ultra vires.
- (b) The Indemnity Conditions are not fundamental to, nor do they go to the root of, the DA, and a Modification Application should be made to Council to remove them from the DA on this basis.

What this advice covers

This advice focuses on the following issues:

Are the Indemnity Conditions unlawful? 2

Are the Indemnity Conditions severable from the DA? 4

Are the Indemnity Conditions unlawful?

The Indemnity Conditions are unlawful. The Court has made it clear, in Galandon and Hutchison, that the requirement to indemnify a consent authority in a condition of development consent does not fulfil a valid planning purpose and is *ultra vires*.

Power to impose conditions

- To be valid, a condition of development consent must:
 - (a) have a planning purpose;
 - (b) fairly and reasonably relate to a development; and
 - not be so unreasonable that no reasonable planning authority could have imposed it.
- This principle was established in the English case of *Newbury District Council v Secretary of State for the Environment* [1981] AC 578 and has been applied in this country by numerous authorities.
- Those considerations that a consent authority may take into account when imposing a condition of development consent are set out in section 79C of the EPA Act and section 80A of the EPA Act sets out an exhaustive list of the types of conditions that may be imposed in a development consent.
- Neither the Newbury Decision (and the cases implementing it in Australia) nor section 80A of the EPA Act authorise a condition of development consent requiring the indemnification of a consent authority.
- 5 Judicial consideration of attempts at requiring the indemnification of a consent authority by way of a condition of consent is considered below.
- Case law

Galandon Pty Ltd v Narrabri Shire Council

- In the case of *Galandon Pty Ltd v Narrabri Shire Council* (1983) 51 LGRA 5 (**Galandon**), Narrabri Shire Council granted development consent for the erection of a motel on floodprone land. A condition of that development consent required the applicant to provide an indemnity in favour of council, to secure it in the event that an action in negligence was brought against it as a result of the grant of development consent.
- 8 McClelland CJ stated [at 9]:

"In my view, an Indemnity ... the object of which was to secure a consent authority under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act against liability in an action in negligence which might be brought as a result of a

authority with a release or indemnity will not serve a proper planning purpose and, consequently, be *ultra vires* and unlawful.

Accordingly, in our view, the imposition of the Indemnity Conditions in nbn's DA was ultra vires and those Indemnity Conditions are unlawful.

Are the Indemnity Conditions severable from the DA?

The Indemnity Conditions are not fundamental to, nor do they go to the root of, the DA, and a Modification Application should be made to Council to remove them from the DA on this basis.

- Having found that the Hutchison Indemnity Condition was invalid, Cowdroy J next considered whether it was severable from the consent. His Honour considered the applicable tests for severability, referring to:
 - (a) Wechsler v Auburn Council (1997) 130 LGERA 134, in which the Court stated that:

"The test is whether the rejection of the invalid part would have the result that the balance or remaining part of the provision would operate differently or in some other way would produce a different result."

- (b) Randwick Municipal Council v Pacific-Seven Pty Ltd (1989) 69 LGRA 13, in which the Court applied a test of whether the condition was "fundamental and went to the very root of the consent."
- (c) Winn v Director General of National Parks and Wildlife Service [2001] NSWCA 17, in which the NSW Supreme Court of Appeal held that:

"A condition (or part of one) may be severable where it is superimposed on a consent if it is incidental, trivial, unimportant or mere surplusage. If a condition is fundamental to the whole of the consent, it cannot be severed and the whole consent is invalid.

- (d) Greek Australian Finance Corp Pty Ltd v Sydney City Council (1974) 29 LGRA 130, in which the Court held that a condition was not severable as it "was a fundamental element of the approval".
- 16 Applying these tests, Cowdroy J held that:

"[39] In the present circumstance the [Hutchison Indemnity Condition] is irrelevant to any planning purpose, its object being directed solely to the indemnification of council. Such condition is not one which goes "to the root of the planning permission itself". Instead the interests of the council only are served by the condition. Accordingly on application of this test, the condition is severable.

[40] Were the Court to adopt the test for severability as enunciated by Talbot J in Wechsler the same conclusion would result. It cannot be said that the consent could not operate without the [Hutchison Indemnity Condition] or would operate in a "fundamentally different way to the original instrument" (per Talbot J in Wechsler). A condition which has no planning purpose could not be fundamental to the development. If excised, the consent would operate in precisely the same way as envisaged by council, except that council would be deprived of the indemnity to which it has no statutory entitlement. Accordingly under either test the Court determines that the indemnity condition is severable from the consent." [emphasis added]

development consent granted by such consent authority would constitute a breach of that Act." [emphasis added]

His Honour then referred to section 90 of the EPA Act, as it then was, which is comparable to the current section 79C of the EPA Act, stating:

"Since the matters to which a consent authority is directed by s. 90 to give consideration are limited to the matters enumerated in that section the imposition of a condition, in order to be a valid exercise of the power conferred by s. 91, must relate to one or more of such matters. In other words, the condition must be such as is required to give proper effect to the conclusions which a consent authority has reached as a result of proper consideration of a matter or the matters referred to in s. 90. Since the specific enumeration of matters for consideration in s. 90 excludes all other matters there is no power to impose conditions at large. The power must be located in the Act (s. 90 or, though not here relevant, s. 94). A condition having the effect of absolving a consent authority of any legal consequences of a negligent grant of consent finds no basis in any of the matters enumerated in s. 90. Such a condition is therefore ultra vires the Act." [emphasis added]

Hutchison 3G Australia Pty Ltd v Waverley Council

- In Hutchison 3G Australia Pty Ltd v Waverley Council [2002] NSWLEC 151 (Hutchison), an applicant sought development consent for the erection of a telecommunications facility.
- Waverley Council sought to impose the following condition on the grant of development consent:

"That prior to the release of this consent the applicant must agree in writing to release Council from all legal liabilities from risks incurred including any possible future adverse health impacts of electric magnetic radiation [sic] associated with the erection, maintenance and operation of this infrastructure."

(Hutchison Indemnity Condition)

Drawing upon the conclusion in Galandon, Cowdroy J observed that a consent authority is required to give consideration to those matters stipulated in the EPA Act. In Hutchison, as today, those matters are set out in section 79C. Cowdroy J noted that:

"The [Hutchison Indemnity Condition] is not directed to the interests of the public safety [sic] or preservation or well being of the public. Instead it is directed solely to the issue of protecting the council from any liability in the event that a claim is made against it for damages relating to the effects of [electromagnetic radiation]. The sole beneficiary of the [Hutchison Indemnity Condition] is the council, not the residents. Such condition could not be classified as one made in "the public interest" as referred to in s79C(1)(e) of the EP&A Act since no protection whatsoever is provided to the public. It follows that the [Hutchison Indemnity Condition] does not satisfy the test of validity, namely, that it relates to a "planning purpose"." [emphasis added]

Conclusion

Having regard to the decisions in Galandon and Hutchison, it is clear that a condition of development consent which seeks to provide a consent

17 The Indemnity Conditions fall into the same category of severability as the Hutchison Indemnity Condition. Accordingly, they are severable from the DA and a Modification Application should be made to Council for their removal.

nbn is pleased to have an opportunity to respond to submissions made to Council regarding the Section 96(1A) application to modify the development consent for DA2014/387 for a proposed **nbn**[™] fixed wireless (telecommunications) facility at 11 Dees Lane, Lynwood, NSW (Lot 5, DP245043).

nbn has reviewed all submissions published on Council's website up to close of business on Friday 20 November 2015. In doing so, we note that of the 49 objections published, 43 of them are not individually made submissions in the proper sense, but are pro-forma letters simply signed by residents across the local government area, which represent little difference to a petition. Of the pro-forma letters submitted, only 8 of them came from Lynwood or Uralba.

Conversely, 25 submissions have been made in favour of the Section 96(1A) Application, and we note that these were substantive, individually-written submissions from local residents.

Issues Raised in Submissions

nbn highlights that the Section 96(1A) Application seeks a modification of consent, and by advertising the Application, Council has invited comment regarding the merits of the modification, and not the merits of the approved DA. Accordingly, it is only the conditions the subject of the modification application that are open for comment. In this respect, nbn notes that none of the submissions opposed to the Section 96(1A) Application have addressed the lawfulness of the indemnity conditions, which is the sole issue of the Application. None of the submissions have supplied evidence or argument to suggest that the indemnity conditions can be lawfully retained.

Most of the submissions incorrectly seek to address the merits of the approved DA. Consequently, many issues raised are therefore not pertinent to the Application before Council. These include visual impact, property values, consultation, service delivery, future plans for the airport's expansion, aviation safety, and alternative sites. These are all matters that were assessed as part of the approval of the original development application.

Visual Impact and Property Values

These issues, which have been properly considered in the approval of the Development Application, are not pertinent to the Section 96(1A) Application.

Consultation

This issue is not relevant to the Section 96(1A) Application. Nevertheless, **nbn** respectfully maintains that appropriate consultation, significantly in excess of statutory requirements, has been undertaken at Uralba.

Service Delivery

This issue is not relevant to the Section 96(1A) Application. However, it is noted that a number of the objections suggest that the approved facility should now be considered redundant, because some residents of Uralba are able to connect to the adjoining network facility at Teven.

nbn respectfully advises Council that residents serviced by adjoining network facilities were never the intended recipients of service from this approved facility. nbn has advised Council that the facility in Dees Lane is designed to provide service to more than 210 local premises across Lynwood and Uralba, and this continues to be the case. These premises cannot receive a service from Teven. The number of submissions in support of the original application and the modification application from local residents who cannot connect to reliable broadband underscores the need for this facility.

Airport Expansion Plans

This issue, which has been properly considered in the approval of the Development Application, is not relevant to the Section 96(1A) Application. Nevertheless, nbn respectfully maintains that detailed, expert analysis submitted to Council has demonstrated that the proposed facility, which is 11km away from the airport, will have no impact on future expansion of aviation operations.

Aviation Safety

This issue, which has been properly and extensively considered in the approval of the Development Application, is, again, not relevant to the Section 96(1A) Application submitted to Council, which is limited to the conditions of consent containing the indemnity.

The indemnity Ballina Shire Council has conditioned does not in any way improve community safety or aviation safety.

nbn highlights that Council has not sought an indemnity as part of its approval of our adjoining fixed wireless network facility at Teven, nor has it previously sought an indemnity in conjunction with other communications towers approved at Teven, all of which also protrude the airport's Obstacle Limitation Surface. In addition to the fundamental question of its lawfulness, there is no safety-based rationale that dictates that an indemnity should be sought for this structure, but not for others approved in the same circumstances.

Importantly, **nbn** is accountable for the safety of its structures, and Council's request for an indemnity has no bearing on the legal and moral responsibility we take for our own network.

Alternative Sites

This issue, which has been properly and extensively considered in the approval of the Development Application, is also not relevant to the Section 96(1A) Application submitted to Council, which is limited to the removal of conditions of consent containing the indemnity.

While the option of relocation to an alternative site is irrelevant to the Application to remove the consent conditions containing the indemnity, **nbn** would like to take this opportunity to address this question conclusively.

Many of the submissions, including the pro-forma letter, obliquely refer to a viable alternative site without ever actually identifying it. However, **nbn** did receive a request from Council on 21 October 2015 to consider three alternatives sites off Forest Rd: in the Uralba Nature Reserve; within the private property at 166 Forest Rd, and within the road reserve off Forest Rd. **nbn** has advised Council in writing that none of three alternative locations is considered feasible, as outlined again here below:

- Locating a facility in the Uralba Nature Reserve, which is zoned E1 National Parks and Reserves, has considerably less planning merit than the approved facility.
- The landowner of 166 Forest Rd has confirmed her lack of interest in hosting a facility on her property.
- Crown Lands has confirmed to nbn that they will not entertain a facility within the unmade road reserve off Forest Rd.

In the past **nbn** has shown flexibility and co-operation with Council by relocating and redesigning other facilities at Teven and at Tuckombil. It is not for lack of trying, nor for a lack of cooperation that **nbn** has concluded that no other locations are viable at Uralba. Viability depends on its planning merits, accessibility (property constraints), and technical ability to provide a service, and no alternative location has been found over a 12-month period of community discussion that can be considered truly viable.

Indemnity "offered by nbn"

The pro-forma letter and individual submissions make the claim that **nbn** "offered" an indemnity to Council. This is not correct. During the application process **nbn** outlined that it is responsible for both the liability and maintenance of its own network infrastructure. **nbn** did not make an offer to indemnify Ballina Shire Council. Additionally, **nbn** did not receive or agree to any formal advice from Council ahead of the Approval that it would seek to impose conditions of consent requiring an indemnity by **nbn** as part of the Development Application being approved. Furthermore, **nbn** received no verbal or written request or advice from Council following the meeting of 28 May 2015 regarding the indemnity conditions.

Conclusion

nbn respectfully asserts that the Application for assessment does not involve an assessment of the merits of the approved DA. It strictly relates to the merits of the subject matter of the proposed modification application.

We appreciate that all of the submitters have strong views regarding the development consent, but, unfortunately, many of the submissions received incorrectly conflate issues that are not pertinent to this Application.

None of the submissions received in opposition to the Section 96(1A) Application have identified reasons why the proposed modification should be refused for legal reasons, nor do any of the objections provide any suggestion as to how Council can lawfully retain the indemnity conditions when legal precedent demonstrates such conditions are unlawful.

nbn respectfully maintains that the conditions containing the indemnity do not serve a proper planning purpose and consequently, are ultra vires and unlawful. We highlight that the conditions also serve no civil aviation or community safety purpose.

We respectfully request that Council assess and determine the Section 96(1A) Application as a matter of urgency, to provide certainty to anxious residents and to **nbn**.

Re: Ballina-Gateway Airport OLS Assessment – Development Application – General Referral.

I refer to the correspondence dated July 1 2014, requesting CASA's assessment of the development planning proposal to erect a Telecommunications facility, at 11 Dees Lane Lynwood.

CASA has assessed the proposed development; the assessment included the consideration of comments from the Ballina/Byron Gateway Aerodrome, Airservices and CASA Flying Operations.

Council has calculated the proposed development, to the nominated maximum height of 225 m Australian Height Datum (AHD), will be a penetration of the of the Ballina/Byron Gateway aerodrome's Obstacle Limitation Surfaces (OLS).

As assessed by the management team of the Ballina/Byron Gateway aerodrome, the Approach Surface contour at this point is 191.5 m AHD, and at this height the development at its highest point will infringe the Approach Surface in excess of 20 m.

CASA has determined that the structure will be a hazardous object under regulation 139.370(1) of the *Civil Aviation Safety Regulations 1998*, because of its height and location within the approach surface.

CASA also supports the assessment that the airport's Take-Off/Climb and Approach Slopes are critical areas for aircraft activity and safety; and any infringement of these surfaces pose an inherent risk to aviation operations.

The aerodrome operator must take all reasonable measures to ensure the full margin of safety for aircraft in these areas, and seriously consider any development that would be likely to infringe the Take-Off/Approach surfaces.

However; if Council considers as part of your own safety and risk management approach that the application is to be approved, CASA recommends that the structure be obstacle lit by a medium intensity flashing red lights at the highest point of the structure. Obstacle lights are to be arranged so as to at least indicate the points or edges of the object to ensure the object can be observed in a 360 radius as per subsection 9.4.3 of the Manual

of Standards Part 139 - Aerodromes. Characteristics for medium intensity lights are stated in subsection 9.4.6.

CASA also recommends that the structure should be obstacle marked in alternating red and white bands of colour in accordance with subsection 8.10.2 of the Manual of Standards (MOS) – Part 139 Aerodromes.

This assessment does not include any crane activity required during construction if approved. Any such crane activity that exceeds the OLS height of 191.5 m AHD will require a separate assessment.

If obstacle lighting is undertaken as suggested above, then In accordance with regulation 139.350(1) of the *CASR 1998* and subsection 7.1.4 and 9.4.10 of the Manual of Standards – Part 139 Aerodromes, Ballina/Byron Gateway Aerodrome is to monitor the ongoing availability of the obstacle lighting.

For detailed requirements for the monitoring of obstacle lights within the aerodrome's OLS refer to subsection 9.4.10 of MOS Part 139.

DA 2014/387 11 Dees Lane Lynwood. NBN tower.

Proposal for council to amend the development consent by deleting the condition of consent requiring NBN Co to legally indemnify council.

As affected residents, we felt relief in May of this year when council passed the application to erect an NBN Fixed wireless Tower at Lynwood, given the inferior internet services currently available in our area.

Internet speeds in our area regularly drop to as little as 0.79mbs download and 0.39mbs upload. Such speeds can make doing work-related computer-based activities and even childrens' homework impossible at times. We already find ourselves at a relative disadvantage with respect to the basic internet speeds previously enjoyed by residents in other areas. This disadvantage will be exaggerated as the rest of the community moves to speeds of 25 to 100mbs and as new programmes are designed to run at these higher speeds.

It was pleasing to see that councillors were able to recognise that the Tower indeed has planning merit in so far as;

- It is a construction which will provide critical infrastructure to over 200 residents currently receiving substandard internet services.
- From the perspective of visual and environmental impacts, it is located in a site fundamentally no different to the many similar NBN towers already approved by Ballina Council in similar semi-rural localities within the shire.
- There are no suitable alternative sites for the provision of such a facility that will provide an adequate wireless broadband signal to as many of the residents in the Uralba / Lynwood area as possible, without encountering the same aviation issues.
- Uralba residents will NOT be offered the new Satellite services of NBN (which
 are in any case inferior to fixed wireless broadband) and as such Uralba will
 likely be left as an internet black hole.

Following our own investigations, we were perplexed by the Ballina Airport's opposition to the Tower on the grounds it breaches the Airport's Grade 3 OLS, given that:

- OLS breaches by objects around airports are a very common event in aviation.
- . The tower is 11km away from the airport.
- There are already trees and other structures higher than the tower in the proximate area.
- CASA have not blocked the construction of the tower, but allowed Council discretion to build the tower provided it is marked and lit.

- Aviation Projects have independently reviewed the Tower and found it to comply with Aviation guidelines.
- Ballina Council has already approved other structures that breach the Airport OLS, as have many other Councils around the country in similar circumstances.

We were impressed that councillors were able to assimilate the vast amount of technical information involved and ultimately use commonsense to see that not only is the tower unlikely to be an aviation hazard, but in fact can improve aviation safety by serving as a beacon to identify the surrounding currently less visible trees and objects.

Should Ballina Airport look to upgrade its operations and fly larger planes, thereby requiring a Grade 4 OLS, then even much of the ground in the surrounding area would also penetrate the OLS.

If a decision is made that the Tower poses an unacceptable risk to council then it would logically follow that any other protruding obstacles would also pose an unacceptable risk. Therefore the current existing situation would be unacceptable and any airport expansion plans requiring a Grade 4 OLS would pose an even greater risk and as such, should not be allowed to proceed.

Ironically, the tower as proposed would serve as a simple-solution to mitigate aviation risk in all circumstances, by identifying these intruding features. It should be considered a safety measure and not a risk or liability.

Given the strong evidence as to the safety and merit of the tower, we are now dismayed and frustrated to find its construction further delayed by the council's express request for indemnity from NBN because;

- Our understanding is that council has not requested such a clause in other similarly approved towers.
- We believe that legal advice has deemed that this request is 'unlawful' and beyond the powers of council to request.
- Removing the clause should in no way remove NBN's fundamental legal responsibility for its infrastructure.
- Even as non-legal laypersons, it appears to us to be a redundant clause, if the councillors have already concluded that the tower is safe and has planning merit.

We do not wish to see this project delayed further, or ratepayers' dollars unnecessarily wasted in legal battles. Our community members are becoming increasingly disadvantaged on a daily basis by delays in approving the tower.

We believe that council drew the correct conclusion in approving the tower in May and that this approval should stand in it's own right, without the indemnity clause.

We thank your for your consideration of our point of view.

To the Planning Officer and Councillors

I wish to express my support for the amended Development Consent 2014/387.

This NBN service from Dees Lne is an important link for myself and others living in the Bottom 9% in Australia today of poor internet services

Despite Council approving the Lynwood/Uralba Tower in May this year, there have unfortunately been further delays in its development...

When Council approved the Tower they added an unusual clause requiring NBN to indemnify Council over and above what is normally required.

NBN have looked into this extensively and have found Councils' request for *indemnity is in fact unlawful*.

NBN has advised Council of this and applied to have the DA consent amended. However, this now has to go back to a Council meeting to once again be voted on.

This means it is possible Council's earlier approval could be overturned, again leaving our community stranded without upgraded internet services for an indefinite period.

A strong community response will show, not only the importance of this issue to many residents and ratepayers but also that we are all monitoring the actions of council carefully.

Read on if you would like to understand more about the details of what has happened...

When council approved the Tower in May of this year, they agreed that the Tower had planning merit and deemed it safe and reasonable to construct.

After all, it was no different to the countless thousands of structures of significance already in existence around Ballina and other airports all around Australia in similar circumstances.

It was even noted by council that it would *improve air safety* by marking surrounding currently invisible objects.

However, for some unexplained reason, the day before the meeting council added a caveat that the tower would only be approved if NBN agreed to indemnify (take legal responsibility from) the council for any incidents which arose from the tower's existence.

NBN have taken issue with this caveat because they have legal advice that it is not only outside the council's powers to request it but actually 'unlawful' to request it.

Whilst NBN maintain that they still assume a normal implicit liability for their infrastructure, allowing such an unnecessary written caveat would create a precedent that may cause avoidable issues with their national rollout.

The new DA Proposal is for council to vote to remove this indemnity clause and therefore allow the approval of the Tower to stand without it. If this occurs, then construction can start as soon as practicable. However if council votes against the new proposal then a stalemate ensues.

We understand that NBN would then likely move to legal action. Legal opinion is that NBN would ultimately win the legal action. However, in the meantime council would face perhaps half a million dollars in costs and reparations and our community would be left without a tower indefinitely as the legal process could take years before resolution.

So it is in our community's interest to ensure council make the correct decision now so that this is resolved as soon as possible.

We've have in the past proven how strong and capable our community hub is in fighting for what's right and to the best way forward.

To the Councillors and Planning Officer,

I wish to express my support for the amended Development Consent 2014/387.

Current internet services are extremely poor in this area. The best connection we can get is ADSL 1 and due to poor line quality the actual speed we can get is nowhere near the theoretical limit of ADSL1. As an example, I have previously had to upload 100MB of data for a client and the speed was 20Kb/second. The upload took over an hour to complete. This is ridiculously slow for 2015.

I work in computer programming and Geographic Information Systems (mapping). I use the internet from my home office every work day for software updates, downloading data and communicating with clients in Brisbane and Sydney.

My wife is a science teacher and also uses the internet extensively for work. As well as her normal position she also works with Southern Cross University delivering live web-cam tutorials to university students. During these tutorial sessions no-one else in the house is allowed to use the internet at all as it drops out my wife's connection and disrupts the tutorials.

I have two children at school in Alstonville that also use the internet for homework and to communicate with friends. My eldest daughter completed her HSC last year and was regularly complaining about the lack of internet speed.

The current and future importance of a reliable and fast internet connection cannot be overstated in the world that we now live in. The internet is now critical infrastructure and geographical areas with fast connections have a real competitive and financial advantage over those that don't.

I attended the previous Council meeting in May on this matter and was impressed at the common sense approach taken by councillors in approving the Lynwood/Uralba NBN Tower. There is no reason to change this approval.

It is a serious concern that Council is considering an expensive and lengthy legal process if the previous approval is revoked. This would leave the local community in a state of limbo with extremely poor internet services. The level of support that the tower received from the community clearly shows that it is an extremely important issue. In the next Council election residents would likely vote for/against councilors based entirely on this issue.

I would truly appreciate councillors having the vision to recognise the importance of the internet and to approve the amended Development Consent 2014/387 for the long term benefit of all Uralba residents.

It saddens me to once again be in the situation where I feel I need to fight for my community's right to basic infrastructure. As you are aware our internet service in Uralba is devastatingly slow and if not resolved we will suffer: decreased property values; losses of productive people who will have to sell up and run their home businesses elsewhere; and the fact that our children will be unable to complete simple homework tasks. To say we will be severely disadvantaged as a result of no NBN is no exaggeration - this is a very serious and unacceptable situation.

We were elated most of you chose to stand up for absolute commonsense and vote for the Uralba NBN Tower to go ahead in May this year. However we were confused as to the addition of the requirement that NBN indemnify Council. Either the tower is safe or it isn't. You can't on one hand tell our community that the NBN Tower will **improve** our safety by adding a light to alert aircraft, not only of the Towers' existence, but of the hundreds of other objects in the vicinity that penetrate the OLS. But then on the other hand make it subject to an indemnity clause, which no other Australian council had requested before in exact circumstances, which puts into question the Tower's safety merits.

The NBN Tower was approved by 8 Councillors on its vital importance to our community and the commonsense view that... how could this tower be too hazardous when there are already other objects similar height or higher? And that it would in fact improve safety by providing a visual reference point as well as being marked on navigation maps. Surely this is a win for the community on both fronts: normal internet services; and improved safety for all of us living under the flight path?

In the event that the approval was overturned, what message would that send to our community? Council would have itself admitted that it currently operates a flight path unsafely, due to all the other significant OLS breaches that would remain unmarked and unlit, and putting all our lives in danger. The Uralba/Lynwood community will not accept one rule being applied in our current situation and another when it comes to the NBN Tower. CASA makes no distinction between manmade and natural hazards. And cutting down the trees will not solve the problem either as even the land penetrates the OLS. In reality, if the NBN tower is not safe, then this flight path is not safe and should be moved.

We hope, however, that this commonsense approach will continue to prevail now that Council's request for indemnity turns out to be unlawful. We hope this situation will be swiftly dealt with and Council doesn't become involved in a legal battle with NBN that would not only waste our rates, but also delay even further this vital infrastructure. And we hope Council doesn't state that we all currently live in unsafe circumstances, opening a can of worms, which our community most definitely would not be able to ignore.

There are certain things that are abundantly clear from the video recording of the Council meeting on 28 May 2015, namely:

- The Mayor informed Councillors that he had reached an agreement with the Acting General Manager of NBN that if Council approved the DA that NBN would provide an indemnity.
- Based on this a Senior Councillor, Keith Johnson, moved the approval of the DA subject to a condition requiring the provision by NBN of an indemnity as agreed.
- Representatives of NBN were present in the Council Chamber and did not seek to correct the information provided by the Mayor to Councillors regarding the agreement which the Mayor understood had been made.
- Councillors embraced the conditional motion of approval and voted in support of it.



I wish to lodge the following objection to the proposed S. 96 Application.

The Process of Development Approval

The whole process of approval is tainted and NBN should be legally restrained from implementing the approval regardless of whether the condition of consent "does not serve a proper planning purpose".

DA 2014/387 was submitted to Council and reported on by Council's Professional Officers and the Manager of the Ballina Byron Gateway, all of whom recommended to Council that the application be refused.

The application came before Council on 28 May 2015. During the discussion in Council the issue was raised that as the tower when built would not comply with Civil Aviation Safety Regulations that in the event of an incident involving the tower, Council might be held liable in damages.

Indeed, a transcript of an address made to Councillors by Mayor Wright during the meeting records him making the following comments to his fellow Councillors before a vote was taken:

"I was really worried about liability of Council for damages if an incident occurred involving the tower and I was really worried about maintenance and things like that. Because we were told at our briefing that if Council approved this structure it would .. the wording stated that it had to be in our safety report and that Council would be responsible, the Airport would be responsible that means every single rate payer would be responsible for everything that goes on.

So that's virtually his wording. I said could I have something like that. So that wording 'subject to appropriate conditions including that the proponent that NBN is responsible for maintenance and liabilities associated with the tower and indemnifies Ballina Council and Ballina Byron Bay Airport from any liabilities concerning the tower protrusion above the OLS'.

Now that might have to be finessed by our Executive Officers and by NBN. But that is what I was promised yesterday. And I think, if what would happen, if that didn't get promised there most likely be a re-visit to the matter because that is the essential part of it, taking it from his word yesterday."

The Mayor stated regarding the indemnity:

"But that is what I was promised yesterday."

Mayor Wright informed Councillors prior to their vote that he had been promised by the Acting General Manager of NBN and the local Federal Government Member that an indemnity would be provided against any damages claimed as a result of an incident involving the proposed tower and the cost of maintaining it.

This was clearly a representation made to Council by the Applicant to induce Council to grant an approval.

It has been pointed out to you that NBN did not have the legal power to provide such an indemnity.

When the representative of NBN, the Acting General Manager, made the offer of indemnity to Council he knew, or ought to have known, that the representation was false.

It follows that the conditional approval obtained by the Applicant was the result of a false representation to Council and the offer of an inducement. Clearly the process of approval is tainted and Council could not be forced to give legal effect to it.

Consequences for Council if condition is removed:

REPCON has confirmed that CASA does not have the legislative power to block the building of the tower nor does the hazard marking of the tower make it compliant with the Civil Aviation Safety Regulations. If the tower is erected, as proposed, and the question is posed:

"Does the Ballina Byron Gateway Airport comply with Civil Aviation Safety Regulations?"

The answer must be "No".

Should Council wish at some time in the future to lease or sell the airport then this could well be an impediment to sale or serve to reduce the sale price.
