5. Outstanding Business

(a) Stormwater and drainage matters (from 20 March 2017 meeting)

Ms Wilcox raised concerns regarding safety, access and property damage in the vicinity of Gibbon Street, Megan Crescent and Dodge Lane in Lennox Head arising from the recent intense rain event.


Mr Truman advised that staff is aware of the conditions and deploy responses as considered appropriate. Remedial options are limited, given the location is relatively flat and low-lying.

It was suggested that primary outlets which drain this area of Lennox Head to Seven Mile Beach require improved maintenance to remove obstructions caused by beach sand. Mr Truman indicated that the current drainage maintenance program is considered adequate in this location, however staff are investigating the rainfall data for this event, including the duration of the flooding and this will be assessed against the expected capacity of the existing infrastructure to determine if upgrade works should be considered.

Further to the flooding experienced in Gibbon Street in recent rain events, Council's technical officers have completed a preliminary desktop review of the drainage system. This review has identified a number of possible factors contributing to this issue, however a more detailed hydraulic assessment using our design software (DRAINS) is required to confirm the effect of these factors and to propose a solution. Attached is a copy of a catchment plan for the area. The factors so far identified that are possibly impacting on the performance of this system include:

- An existing 1,200 mm diameter outlet is partially blocked. Works to address this and to extend the outlet to improve gravity drainage are planned to be undertaken as part of the Byron Street Sewer Pump Station upgrade. We also plan to dewater and jet the line to further inform our investigations.
- The upstream pipe network appears to be hydraulically inefficient with Megan Crescent street drainage being routed through to Dodge Lane despite a trunk main being available in Megan Crescent.
- It is possible there is additional runoff associated with the Community Centre and Park Lane being routed through the drainage network.

Staff will continue to advance this investigation as resources allow.



(b) Signage Adjacent to Marine Rescue Tower (from 20 March 2017 meeting)

Ms Leuckel asked that signage be arranged by Council to alert the community that a defibrillator, retained by Marine Rescue, is available within the facility, in case of an emergency.

Mr Truman indicated that he will look into the matter.

Council's records indicate we wrote to Marine Rescue in response to its request to install a sign on the tower and we advised we approve the installation subject to Marine Rescue providing written confirmation that the defibrillator is owned and operated by Marine Rescue and public access to it is managed by Marine Rescue and not Council.

In response to this recent request, a Council officer has contacted the Marine Rescue Area Coordinator and the Coordinator has advised that a number of Marine Rescue buildings have a sign advising of a defibrillator on the building and that Marine Rescue were responsible and would install a sign.

(c) Lyn Walker – Stormwater and drainage matters

The path in the vicinity of Sharpes Beach car park and underpass does intersect a couple of natural drainage paths and the design has not included infrastructure to convey these flows under the path.

In response we propose to establish two small drainage crossings through/under the existing AC path to mitigate overland flow post a rainfall event and install some minor earthworks to extend the swale from the underpass at the end of the concrete V drain for one of the constructed crossings.

We expect to complete these works in July.

(d) Bush Regeneration - Weed Growth - Coast Road

Council staff are aware of the regrowth of weed species in certain coastal locations following the completion of ongoing weed control funding from the State Government. A recent weed control application was unsuccessful and Council has recently reported on the significant shortfall in resources to undertake weed control across the bushland areas under its control.

Additional resources are required to target weeds at these locations and presently no funding exists. Staff will continue to support volunteers and apply for grant applications for weed control in these high profile locations.

(e) Coastal Recreational Path/Bush Regeneration

No further action required until the letter is forwarded to Council by Coast Care.

(f) Proposed Olympic Training Facility

Due to considerable public interest in this proposal, the Development Application for Lot 140, DP 755725, 164 Camp Drewe Road, Lennox Head, has been withdrawn by the applicant (NSW Sport & Recreation) under Clause 52 of the Environmental Planning & Assessment Regulation 2000.

(g) Sand Quarry - Newrybar Swamp Road

John Truman has attempted to locate the advice to Councillors from Rod Willis. Unfortunately a record of the advice is not available. The advice was likely to be sent by email and unfortunately, at the time of writing this note, Rod Willis has commenced a period of leave and will not return prior to the Committee meeting. However, the meeting minute does reflect the sentiment of the advice from Rod in respect of the level of compliance with the current consents and that Council has taken a number of steps over the years to improve its compliance management for quarry operations.

In respect of the traffic counts, the available data has been provided to Cr Williams. The traffic count data provided was for Newrybar Swamp Road and some Ross Lane counts near the Newrybar Swamp Road intersection, however the counts for Newrybar Swamp Road actually show trucks as only having a small proportion of the total vehicle count. This can be explained by low volume quarrying activity occurring during the time the count was undertaken, and the relatively higher small vehicle numbers being cars attending the swimming centre. As advised during the Committee meeting, a development application for quarry activities would need to include a traffic analysis supported by count data collected for that purpose. Our count would not be sufficient or suitable as we collect the information for different uses, such as speed zones, strategic road network modelling and these are not related to change of use at an individual property level.

(h) Williams Reserve Lighting

The Council's Delivery Program has a sports fields lighting upgrade program which includes the following projects.

2017/18 Wollongbar Sports Field Project 2018/19 Saunders Oval 2019/20 Pacific Pines 2020/21 Williams Reserve

The budget for this program is typically of the order of \$160,000.

Wollongbar is the current highest priority due to the need to finalise the new sports fields project. Saunders Oval has a very high usage with soccer, touch football, cricket, archery and other activities based at this ground and the condition of the infrastructure has been identified as the highest priority for replacement.

Pacific Pines has been recommended as the next priority to enable the new fields to be utilised at night. This recommendation aimed to maximise the availability of space in Lennox Head by complementing the existing lighting at Williams Reserve.

Council's Group Manager Civil Services and Manager Open Spaces have recently met with the Lennox Head Combined Sports Association and at this meeting it was suggested to the Association it should consider the priority recommendation made by staff for Pacific Pines and Williams Reserve and provide us with its feedback.

Staff have also agreed to investigate whether an interim upgrade is possible, albeit there is currently no budget allocation for this and the cost (even for relatively minor works) will mean that any works will need to be part of the final design upgrade.

(i) Megan Crescent - Reserve

Noted - no further action required from Council unless requested by Landcare to provide trees.

(j) Bora Ring – Gibbon Street Lennox Head

Offer noted. No further action required from Council unless requested.

(k) North Angels Beach Estate Park – Softfall

The deterioration of the softfall surface is noted. The level of deterioration occurring, although not desirable, is considered acceptable for the age and type of softfall installed. The playground is regularly inspected and the softfall is compliant with the safety standards. The condition of the softfall will continue to be monitored to ensure that it complies with the standards.

(I) Megan Crescent - Park

The playground located at Megan Crescent Park has been identified in the Ballina Shire Council Playground Comprehensive Inspection Report as nearing its time for replacement, but is not currently scheduled in the works program for upgrade.

Regular inspections are carried out to ensure the safety and function of our playgrounds. The playgrounds upgrade plan and works program identify priority playgrounds for upgrade and renewal in the allocated budget based on the age and condition of the assets. Megan Crescent Park will be reviewed for inclusion in the next works program.

6. Outstanding Business

(a) Lyn Walker - Stormwater and drainage matters

The Committee noted the response provided by Staff. Further information to be provided on notice.

(b) <u>Lorraine Leuckel – Signage adjacent to the new Ballina Marine</u> Rescue Facility

The Committee noted the response provided by staff.

(c) Fran Byrne - Vegetation management, Coastal Recreational Pathway

Fran Byrne noted the staff response provided in relation to concerns raised regarding vegetation removal but noted that the staff response did not respond to questions regarding damage to certain Pandanus trees. John Truman advised that his enquires indicate that Council was not responsible for the damage to the Pandanus and that it would appear to be an act of vandalism.

(a) Ballina Heights Residences Action Group (BHRAG)

The Committee noted the response provided by staff.

9. Business Without Notice

a) Lou Wilson - Marina Master Plan/Dredging of the Ballina Bar

In relation to the Marina Master Plan Mr Wilson expressed concern with lack of action on the dredging of the Ballina Bar and the need for this to be addressed to make a marina successful. This comment was reinforced by Lorraine Leuckel and Alan Veacock.

b) Bush Regeneration

Raised concerns with weed growth on the verge of the Coast Road south of Shelly Beach Road in the vicinity of the Allowah Bushland and the return of Prickly Pear and Bitou Bush at Shelly Beach.

Council to provide a response.

c) Fran Byrne - Coastal Recreational Path/Bush Regeneration

Ms Byrne advised that Coast Care has received correspondence from the NSW Environmental Trust seeking information regarding the extent of funded bush regeneration that has been impacted by the Coastal Recreational Pathway. John Truman recommended that Coast Care forward a full copy of the correspondence from the Environmental Trust to Council for a formal response.

d) Lyn Walker - Lake Ainsworth Water Quality

Dr Walker congratulated Council regarding the Lake Ainsworth Water Quality Snapshot Report. Dr Walker noted the finding of the report regarding the doubling of Phosphorus in the lake over the last 20 years and supported ongoing monitoring.

e) Lyn Walker - Proposed Olympic Training Facility

Dr Walker sought advice regarding the anticipated decision date for the determination of the Ski Jump development application. John Truman advised that the application has only just been received and further information on submission periods and meeting dates will be made available once a preliminary assessment of the application has been undertaken by staff. Cr Cadwallader tabled the advice from Rod Willis distributed to Councillors regarding the status of the development application, noting that the matter will be determined by the Joint Regional Planning Panel (JRPP). John Truman noted that given the level of community interest in the matter it is likely that the elected Council would make a submission to the JRPP.

f) Lyn Walker - Sand Quarry - Newrybar Swamp Road

Dr Walker queried the rate and extent of sand removal at the sand quarry on Newrybar Swamp Road. Cr Wright advised that Rod Willis has advised that Council has investigated the matter and determined that the current rate of extraction is within the relevant development consents. John Truman also noted that a review was undertaken several years ago in relation to the auditing of this information to verify the accuracy of the extraction rates data. John Truman will enquire as to whether the information provided to Councillors in relation to these investigations can be distributed to the Committee. Mr Truman also noted that any future development applications for expansion of the quarry would be required to undertake further traffic impact assessments to determine potential impacts.

Cr Williams enquired regarding the details of the most recent traffic counts along Newrybar Swamp Road/Ross Lane. John Truman will investigate and advise.

g) Shaun Eastment - Lake Ainsworth Water Quality

Supported Dr Walker's comments regarding the Lake Ainsworth Water Quality Snapshot Report. Cr Williams noted the Council's support for the expansion of the Coastal Zone Management Plan to include Lake Ainsworth.

h) Debbie Smith - Shark Mitigation

Ms Smith noted her attendance at the recent Department of Primary Industries (DPI) stakeholder meeting held in relation to the shark mitigation strategy. She advised that the Department will be undertaking further community engagement to solicit community responses following the completion of the shark mitigation trial. Ms Smith also noted the benefits of the scientific studies that have been undertaken in relation to the trials. He noted, however, that areas of darkness remain which need additional lighting installed (in the area around the cricket nets). John Truman advised that Council has an oval lighting strategy which has recurrent funding sourced from a previous rate rise. John Truman will investigate whether additional works at Williams Reserve can be added to the works program.

n) Lorraine Leuckel - Marine Rescue Tower Opening

Ms Leuckel noted the recent opening of the new Marine Rescue Tower and thanked Council for organising the event.

o) Lorraine Leuckel - North Angels Beach Estate Park - Softfall

Ms Leuckel enquired regarding the black soft-fall park at North Angels Beach Estate and noted residents' concerns that children are walking the deteriorating soft fall into the houses.
