12. Public Question Time

12.1 <u>State Government Quota on Fishers</u>

Tony Puglisi – DPI has issued a quota system for the prawn trawler fishers on the North Coast

Does Council support the dumping of tonnes and tonnes of edible fish very close to their beaches, which will happen from 1 May because of this quota system? Would the Council support that?

Cr David Wright advised that he has spoken to DPI Fisheries to investigate.

Paul Hickey advised that Council does not have a position on the matter but the majority of the people in the room would support your concerns.

Paul Hickey advised that we can follow this up with a Mayoral letter to the Minister.

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12.2 Garden Bed on Public Land

Leona Ross – by way of information I am Mr Truman's next door neighbour and I have been his neighbour for 18 years. Can you please tell me how, what I class as a dangerous footpath obstruction on public land, extending half way down the nature strip to the gutter and painted black, be determined by Council staff as non compliant on 24 September and three months later be then compliant after an inspection by another Council staff member when nothing has changed?

Paul Hickey advised that it was non compliant originally because Council was not aware of the structure. Once it was bought to our attention, our staff followed the matter up and asked the owner of the property to put in an application. That application was assessed by our staff and approved, being consistent with Council's procedures and protocols. Our Risk section has reviewed it as well. Based on the concerns raised today we can further review the matter. The key point is that it was originally not compliant as we did not know about it and it now has approval and is compliant. That's the difference in that period of time.

12.3 Intersection of Summerhill Crescent and Deadmans Creek Road

John Bout – My question is to all of the councillors. I received a letter signed by the Group Manager Civil Services which I have taken around to every resident in Summerhill Crescent and we are most concerned that we continue to be fobbed off by adopting minimum design standards. This letter has been given to every Councillor. Are you aware of the vision restriction we are talking about? Have you personally tried to turn right onto Summerhill Crescent before it is mowed by the swing arm mower? If you look at these pictures that is deemed to be minimum requirement complied and OK, however we have a note that says "we can do better by killing the weeds at the bottom of the pole" which I find extremely indicative of the level of intelligence and experience of the person who wrote it. Now I am going to say this I have put up with this for two years.

The Mayor advised that there was not one set of rules for Mr Bout and one for everyone else.

Mr Bout continued his line of questioning and invited A Ward Councillors to a meeting with residents and the Advocate at 4 pm today.

12.4 Code of Meeting Practice

Greg Burgess – can Council ask ratepayers for input or comments on the Code of Meeting Practice. Is it a public application, do you ask for comments, feedback or suggestions?

Paul Hickey advised that with the Code of Meeting Practice item in today's agenda, Council resolved to exhibit for a period of minimum of 28 days with public submissions and comments being invited for 42 days as per the Local Government Act.

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12.5 <u>Lake Ainsworth - Closure of Eastern Road</u>

Greg Burgess – to the Mayor - are you going to rescind or halt the eastern road closure at Lake Ainsworth?

Paul Hickey – as per the report today in the Capital Works update, the planning consent states that the eastern road closure cannot occur until the Sport and Recreation Centre has their DA determined and I think the consent says until they do their works so it could be a number of months before that DA is determined.

Greg Burgess – the Mayor has a conflict of interest with regard to the voting the closure on 1 September 2018.

Mayor – I don't know what you are talking about sorry.

Greg Burgess – your Code of Conduct – your non declaration of interest in proceedings, in other words, people shouldn't have voted on it but they did. 1 September vote

Mayor – yes but who

Greg Burgess – Cr Cadwallader and Cr Jeff Johnson

Paul Hickey - if someone has a concern about a breach of the Code of Conduct you put a complaint in writing to the General Manager and it will be referred to an independent assessor From my perspective I do not believe a Councillor would have a pecuniary interest in respect to the road closure as there is no direct financial benefit. As to a non pecuniary interest, I would be surprised in respect to that, how you could draw a connection in respect to a Code of Conduct breach for the closure of the eastern road. I would suggest you put that in writing rather than making unsubstantiated comments in this meeting.

Greg Burgess – I am sorry, I did, at the last meeting in writing, to you people.

Cr David Wright – and you got a response.

Greg Burgess – there was no response, virtually.

Paul Hickey – you also got a response to the November meeting. Council also received a response this week from ICAC who reviewed all your complaints and said they will be taking no further action.

Greg Burgess – yes I know, I got one the other day too and there are other Departments still to reply.

Greg Burgess – I will take up your offer to review some of the past minutes and Council documents. So just letting you know about that one.

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Paul Hickey – yes that's right. Kelly Brown responded to you. We keep all our meeting records and you can come in at any time.

12.6 Floodgates

Greg Burgess - Why weren't the floodgates reinstalled on Canal Road? In other words we had the flooding around Tamar Street yesterday and the day before – wouldn't that have been alleviated by having floodgates on the drains?

They were taken off some years and you have had flooding ever since.

Cr David Wright – my understanding is that we are not sure where some of the drainage goes just yet.

Paul Hickey – not too sure why they haven't been installed, but Council has recognised the issue with floodgates. There's \$50,000 in the budget this year for floodgates at Burns Point Ferry Road. I know that Engineering staff are trying a ducted type floodgate and if that works they plan to roll them out in other locations on the Ballina Island. Council is trying to manage the floodgate issue and it's very complex with works going ahead very shortly in Burns Point Ferry Road.

Greg Burgess – well that's a start but Burns Point Ferry Road is not going to cover the township.

Paul Hickey – the idea is to see if they work there as it's one of the key spots, and then roll them out in other locations.

Greg Burgess – well apparently they did work before, and they were removed and never replaced, and you have had the flooding ever since.

Cr David Wright – we have a program now to replace them or looking at replacing them.

12.7 Plateau Skatepark

Greg Burgess – noticed in a Letter to Editor in the Advocate yesterday – you have made a statement and one of the Executive made a statement and they were conflicting statements.

Cr Ben Smith – I chaired the meeting and that definitely wasn't what was said – he said we were looking at a range of options.

Paul Hickey – Staff are putting a report to Council as soon as possible to review all site options with Councillors to then make a decision as to the preferred direction for this project.

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12.8 Sound Mound - Angels Beach Drive

Leona Ross – people in my area have received notice from the Council about target bush regeneration zones regarding the sound mound and how this group is going to tidy up and part of that says on the bottom - "Keep your garden in your garden – do not extend your garden past your property boundary". Does that also apply to the Council because where I am we have these massive trees on Council's sound mound dropping into our garden and it is a full time exercise. I received a letter from Mr Willebrands dated 17 August 2017 and he says the trees appear to be in good health and condition and not overhanging your property. Well they are. They are overhanging the property and secondly "pruning for shade, amenity or leaf drop are non permissible under this policy". So how does that relate to that and how do we keep all of our backyards half tidy when the trees are overhanging.

Paul Hickey advised that Council does plant trees on its land and we need to be mindful of our neighbours. We can give that feedback to staff that they are dropping as we don't want to impact on our neighbours. We will follow that up.

Did the sound mound originally have an EIS and a Development Application? Check that approval because Council vehicles just came in and knocked over four bottlebrush.

Paul Hickey advised that there would have been some sort of planning approval.
