Opposing submissions - summary of key issues

- Impact of skate park on amenity of surrounding residents unacceptable noise impacts from skateboards and groups of teenagers; increase in graffiti of the area;
- Skate park is better located at the Wollongbar sporting fields away from residences;
- Properties adjoining Rifle Range Road already have many amenity issues to deal with such as speeding and noisy traffic;
- Valuable space for other activities taken up by skate park such as children's playground; community garden;
- Concrete skate park not appropriate park should be predominantly a green space;
- Building a skate park in such close proximity to residences that do not already exist is unfair to those future residents;
- The majority of local residents do not want a skate park at this location;
