5. <u>Business Arising from Minutes – 11 July 2019</u>

(a) Roundabout Vegetation – Teven Road

The Committee at the last meeting suggested that this matter, including changing the speed limit to 50km/hour and examination of sight lines, be referred to the local traffic committee.

Council's Traffic Engineer advises the following:

The speed limits on Teven Road were reviewed by the RMS in 2014 and Council was advised of the outcome by letter dated 1 September 2014 which confirmed that Teven Road be 60kph from the Bruxner Highway northwards for a length of 1.4 km.

Teven Road is part of the arterial road network connecting Alstonville via Teven to the Ross Lane Interchange on the Pacific Highway. In the Alstonville urban area it has a wide generally straight alignment that is consistent with its through road function. The function of the road and the nature of adjoining development have not materially changed since the RMS review in 2014.

If the road through the Alstonville urban area was changed from 60 kph to 50 kph, due to the function and alignment of the road, it is believed that there would be widespread non-compliance.

It is considered that the RMS determined speed limit of 60 kph is still appropriate at this time.

Council does not have authority to alter speed zones.

In light of the above, and the previous technical advice presented to the Committee regarding the design of the intersection, until a further direction is

received from Councillors (i.e. a resolution to pursue this matter), staff do not propose to allocate further resources in the assessment of this matter.

(b) Roundabout in Main Street

Jane Gardiner raised concern about the plantings on the roundabout located at the entry to the Alstonville Plaza. The grasses have been removed in favour of pine chips. Landscape plantings are preferred. Matter to be referred to Open Space and Reserves and Engineering Works sections for review.

Staff advise as follows:

Dead vegetation was removed from the roundabout median, and replaced with new plantings. Mulching was undertaken at time of planting as part of general roundabout maintenance.

6. <u>Presentation – Waste Management and Resource Recovery</u>

Samala Heart, Council's Waste Education Officer will provide an update on Council programs to educate residents on waste management and support them towards better resource recovery

7. Staff Presentation - Ballina Arterial Roads Strategy

John Truman will provide an update on Council's long term strategic plans and medium term construction program for upgrading arterial roads accessing Ballina Island and the CBD area.

In the long term, Council's Roads Contribution plan identifies a strategic road works program of \$164M to cater for increased traffic caused by new urban development up to the year 2036.

In June Council allocated adopted a four year budget to deliver \$41M of arterial road works to improve access to the Ballina CBD.

8. Review of Ward Committee Membership

In June 2018 Council gave consideration to a report on community consultation and Ward Committees. One of the resolutions passed at that meeting was as follows:

3. That Council authorises the General Manager to remove any community based groups from the Ward Committees where they have not attended a meeting for at least 12 months, and have not responded to any follow up correspondence issued by Council.
