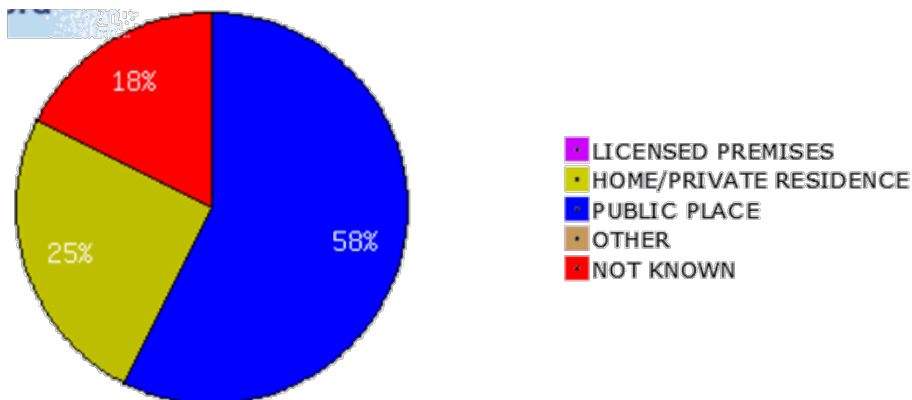
ALCOHOL FREE ZONES – BALLINA & SURROUNDING TOWNSHIPS

An Alcohol Free Zone is an area (such as a car park, public road, and footpath on Crown land) that has been established by a Council where drinking alcohol is prohibited. Alcohol Free Zones assist the New South Wales Police Force in being able to reduce the impact of alcohol related harm within the community.

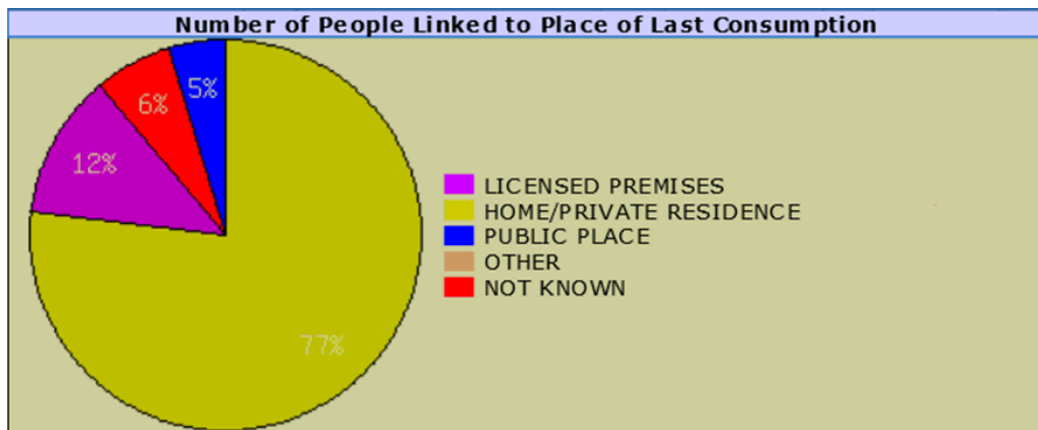
PCA Last Place of Consumption Report

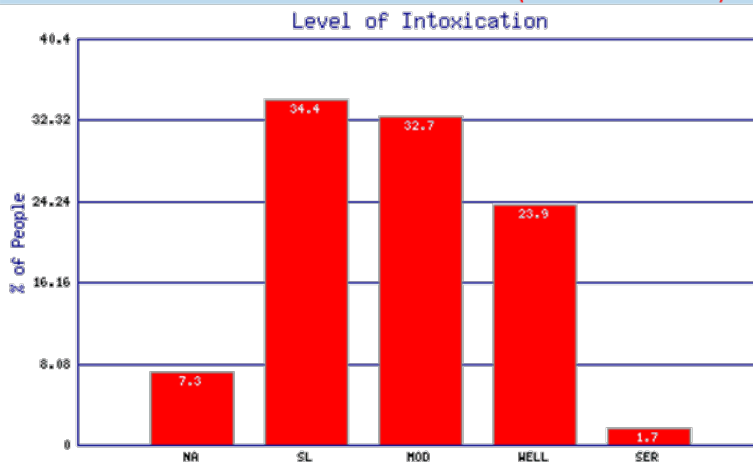


Number of People Linked to LPC Report

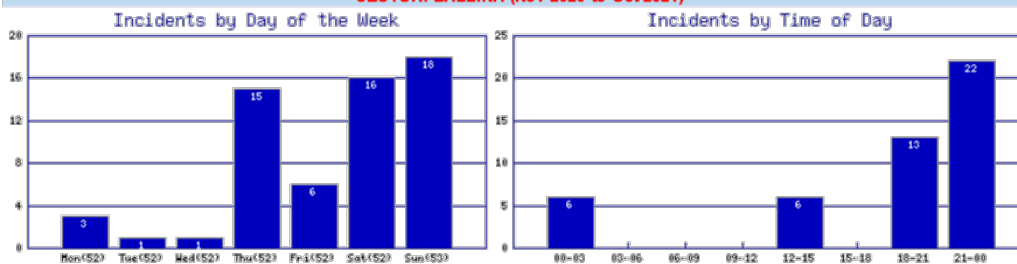

CRIME PREVENTION
