

Mayor's Message

The last five years have been a period of progress for the Ballina Sifie and there have been many achievements and milestones during the term of the elected Council.

Whilst the Council continued to provide and maintain essential infrastructure and services during this term, we also delivered on a number of high quality projects designed to provide long-term benefits to our continuity.

With the Covid-19 pandemic throwing up global challenges, I am very proud of our community shiding by the State and Faderal Governments regulations to help contain the virus in our shire. During this time of change, Ballha Shire Council has followed the Covid-19 guidelines and continued to deliver projects as plannad.

These projects and programs reflect the immediate and future needs and desires of our residents, and importantly, are balanced with the goals of responsible and sustainable fiscal management.

With growth it is essential that we are also investing in infrastructure to ensure that our facilities meet the needs of current and future populations. We have been working closely with the State and Federal Governments to eack their support and funding to continue our momentum in the delivery of new and uggraded infrastructure,

Over the period many projects were completed or underway:

- cOfficial opening of the new \$8 million Wollangbar Sportfields, which now includes AFL field/shicket oxal, nugby union grounds, tennis and netball courts, lighting and clubhouse amenifies
- continued growth at the Ballina Byron Sateway Aigorit with over SQU(000 passengers per annum taking advantage of the approximately 60 direct flighte sach week to Sydney. Newcastie and Melbourne
- substantial improvements to the Shaws Bay area as part of our commitment to the environment
- Implementation of our Healthy Waterways Program to improve the overall health of our major waterbodies
- redevelopment of the Alstonville and Ballina. swimming pools to ensure that we have contemporary facilities for the next 40 years
- continued our compliance with the NSW Governments Fit for the Future program with Council obtaining approval for a permanent special rate variation for 2018/10 and 2019/20.
- continued funding for the completion of the Coastal Shared Path and Coastal Walk projects

that will ensure there is pedestrian and cycling connectivity between Bailina and Lennox Head

 we built the new Bailina Indoor Sports Centre and opened this in 2019.

But it's not all about tangible projects, our work also focuses on building community capacity and engagement:

- during the height of the Covid-19 restrictions, we supported our business community, commercial tenants and ratepayers during this difficult financial period by providing a financial support package
- we have taken up opportunities, particularly in the visitor economy, to support local business by providing direct air services to Canberra and new Dubbo
- established the Business Connect program to link local businesses to residents in self-isolation
- launched a new website and delivered more online services for the community to access more user triendly content;
- Implemented Recycle Right waste education campaign
- provided \$100,000 in donations to community and sporting groups
 endorsed and commenced the Lennox Head
- endorsed and commenced the Leinox Heal Vilage Vision concept plans
 measurement design and emotionation for the
- commenced design and construction for the River Street Duplication project
 obtained planning approval and commenced
- obtained planning approval and commenced construction of the Wollongbar District Park.

Yet we have much to look back on and so much more to look forward to. I encourage you to read our end of term report as it provides a snapshot of our community and what we can achieve by working fooather.
