- 1. That Council approves the temporary closure of River Street on Saturday 29 September and Sunday 30 September 2012 from 6.00 am to 5.00 pm for the purpose of the Ballina Country Music Festival.
- That Council approves the implementation of the attached Traffic Control Plan for the operation of Compton Drive during the construction of Ballina Surf Club and that the Traffic Control Plan be amended to include "End Shared Path" signage.

5. Items to be Referred to Council

5.1 Proposed Ballina CBD Redevelopment

Introduction

Council is currently implementing the Ballina CBD refurbishment. The extent of works ranges from River and Cherry Street through to River and Martin Street. This item is submitted for the Committee's consideration in relation to the regulatory signage and associated line markings.

Information

The project comprises drainage and pavement works, footpath widening and streetscape improvements.

The signage in the CBD refurbishment is based on the existing signage with the following proposed modifications:

- Currently there are two half hour parks in Cherry Street at the corner of Cherry and River Street (Wespac building). It is proposed to remove these and replace them with four parks in River Street. These parks will still to be adjacent to the bank. This means the half hour zone would extend to the existing mail and taxi zones (which shall remain unaltered).
- Extend the half hour parking located on the northern side of River Street between Cherry Street and the old pedestrian crossing eastward.
- Provide two disabled car parks at the new pedestrian crossing.
- 1P Parking in Cherry St, including the new centre parking.
- Provide a small stencilled roundabout at the Cherry and Fawcett Street intersection.
- Provide a new disabled car park on the south eastern side of the new pedestrian crossing.
- Parking to the east of the pedestrian crossing to Martin Street shall remain as 2P.

A copy of the plan is attached for the Committee's information.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Committee approve the signage and parking plan attached to this report for the Ballina CBD Upgrade project.

5.2 Russellton Industrial Estate Criterium

Introduction

The Northern Rivers Cycling Club is seeking approval to hold a criterium cycle race series at the Russellton Industrial Estate, Wollongbar from 1 October 2012 to 31 March 2013 (Wednesday evenings only).







6. Items Referred to General Manager's Delegate

6.1 Request Bus Zone Signage - Bentinck Street

Introduction

A resident has contacted Council seeking modification to parking controls at the bus zone in front of the RSL Life Care building. The request identifies that cars are parking in front of the bus shelter forcing the bus to double park to collect/drop off passengers.

Information

The bus stop in front of the RSL Life Care building forms part of the hail and ride bus stop network. There is a bus shelter adjacent to the J pole.

The resident explained that children are using this bus stop and that the bus had to double park to allow children to alight/disembark during the day.

Vehicles are parking 45° rear to kerb all across the bus shelter frontage.

The resident is seeking the erection of parking controls (bus zone signage) and enforcement of parking in the area.

It is proposed that No Stopping Buses Excepted signage be erected for a distance of not more than 15m from the bus shelter to the driveway.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Committee approve the erection of No Stopping Buses Excepted signage at the Bentinck Street RSL Life Care Bus Stop.

6.2 Request Parking Controls - No Stopping, Kingsford Smith Drive

Introduction

Councils Open Spaces and Reserves have requested the permanent erection of No Stopping signage along Kingsford Smith Drive, Ballina.

Information

Kingsford Smith Drive is a 60km/h road that provides access to adjoining land use activities (Farmers Market, Model Boat Club, and amphitheatre). The road has no kerb and gutter and is bordered by grass verges.

It is reported that the informal parking results in damage to the road formation and also permits parking in areas where vegetation is close to the road.

In order to improve pedestrian access to all users in the area it is proposed to permanently install No Stopping signage on the Northern side of Kingsford Smith Drive. It is also anticipated that through the implementation of No Stopping signage that traffic flows in the area may be more clearly defined creating a greater level of service to all.

A schematic has been included for the information of the Committee.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Committee approve the installation of No Parking signage on the northern side of Kingsford Smith Drive.

6.3 Holy Family Catholic Primary School Entrance Signage

Introduction

Council's Rangers are doing an audit of the Shire's school zones and have requested the signage of Holy Family Catholic Primary School be reviewed.

Information

In the front of the school is a loop road designed to support access to the school for buses, pedestrians, disabled parking and general parking. In the middle of the loop is a pedestrian accessway. This accessway has two zebra crossing linemarkings without signage to formalise the crossing.

Councils Road Safety Officer undertook an analysis of use of the loop and found that there was minimal use (<5 pedestrians) using the crossings. The majority of users used the bus or walked from nearby residential streets.

The primary pickup/setdown area for the school is at the rear with a formal pickup/setdown procedure established. The front of the school is primarily the bus zone.

Council rangers have requested the following parking controls be implemented:

- One disabled space at the front of the school to be marked and appropriately signposted.
- Defining where the Bus Zone and the No Stopping coincide.
- Formalising No Parking around the central island
- Removal of the two crossings.

The School's Principal has been consulted and has advised his support for the proposed modifications.

In regards to the pedestrian crossing, whilst a reduced pedestrian warrant assessment has not been conducted it is expected that due to the low level of use by pedestrians that the PV product criteria would not be met.

A diagram has been included for the information of the Committee.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Committee approve of the modifications to the Holy Family Catholic Primary School entrance as per the plan attached to the above report.

File Note: Road Safety Inspection for Holy Family Catholic Primary School

Principal: Mr Murray Deeps

Observations:

Holy Family Catholic Primary School has a formalised drop and collection point within the school grounds (marked with 'No Parking' signage). The drop off zone is accessed at the rear of the school, off Carroll Avenue. Pedestrian access to the school is also provided at this location. The area directly in front of the school gate is the location for the bus zone. There is also unrestricted parking that some parents are using this area to drop off and collect students. Few parents used the 'No Parking' zone in the inside of the turning circle to drop off students and collect students. Most students accessing the school by the front gate were those using the bus, and pedestrians walking to school from the surrounding streets.

To improve road safety in the vicinity of *Holy Family Catholic Primary School*, consideration should be given to the following:


- The one disabled parking space located at the front entrance to be marked, sign posted and line marked in accordance with AS/NZS 2890.
- The 'No Stopping' signage (at the front entrance of the school) coming off the roundabout to the bus zone should be relocated to the same pole as the bus zone signage and consider line marking to reinforce the no stopping zone.
- There is a 'No Parking' zone on the inside of the turning circle. Currently the location of the 'No Parking' zone encourages the young children to disembark from the vehicle on the roadside as the vegetation on the inside of the turning circle obstructs the ability to disembark on the passenger side, for both the driver and the passenger(s). Consider changing the 'No Parking' restriction to 'No Stopping'. 'No Stopping' signage to be installed in accordance with relevant standard. This will also provide additional space for the buses to move around the circle.
- The current pedestrian crossing facilities (which there are two) are not designed and constructed to relevant design standards for a pedestrian crossing (zebra). Vehicle and bus parking does restrict visibility of pedestrians crossing the road. Considerations should be given to the removal of the two pedestrian crossing facilities. Upon the site inspection(s) very few pedestrians used the two crossings when arriving and departing from the school. Should the pedestrian crossing facility be removed, consideration should be given to blocking the connecting pathway and kerb ramp on the opposite of the side of the road. If the removal of the pedestrian crossing facility is considered, the disability parking space could be relocated to the start of the kerb ramp.
 - **Note:** Pedestrian and vehicle counts have not been conducted. However upon inspection of the site it would be unlikely to meet RMS reduced pedestrian crossing warrant which is 200 vehicles and 30 pedestrians. Formalising the pedestrian crossing facilities would also have implications on the established bus zone (by reducing the length of the bus zone) and reducing the number parking spaces in this vicinity of the front entrance to the school.
- The section of unrestricted parking on the inside circle is predominately used by staff. At the request of the school principal these spaces should be retained.

Other Considerations:

- Consider the installation of a P5 zone for approximately 4 spaces beyond the disability car
 parking space. This would allow for the movement of traffic for cars to drop off and collect on the
 school side. The principal has requested that this be held off and considered as a second phase
 until it is determined whether the additional drop off and pick up space is required. Should a P5
 zone be installed, Council should consult with neighbouring residents.
- At the rear exit of Xavier Catholic College there is a pedestrian pathway which meets and ends
 at Isabella Drive and once across Isabella Drive continues to the pedestrian crossing facility
 (that has been recommended for removal). Consideration should be given to redirecting this
 pathway to the existing pathway leading to the entrance of Holy Family.

Consultation with the school was conducted on Tuesday 31 July, 2012. Mr Murray Deeps, School Principal was supportive of the enclosed considerations.

6.4 Intersection Improvement - Henderson Lane/North Creek Road

Introduction

A resident has written to Council seeking an intersection improvement to the intersection of Henderson Lane and North Creek Road. The resident writes that vehicles are not staying wholly in the traffic lane when turning the corner at Henderson Lane.

Information

The intersection of Henderson Lane and North Creek Road is a Give Way controlled T intersection. North Creek Road has a speed limit of 60 km/h and Henderson Lane has a limit of 50 km/h. The intersection is at the crest of a ridge.

Sight lines are varied depending on the location of the driver. North South sight lines are quite good but sight lines to Henderson Lane and from Henderson Lane are restricted due to both the angle of the T and the approach grade.

The above being the case, drivers have a tendency to cut the corner of Henderson Lane when entering from North Creek Road southbound. The resident is seeking the implementation of a traffic island at the Henderson Lane Give Way.

Typically the inclusion of painted Give Way linemarking and associated signage is sufficient to control drivers travel lines. In this case additional work is required because the linemarking and signage exist.

The Council will need to consider if funds are available for this work if the recommendation below is accepted.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Committee approve the addition of a central median to the Give Way control at the intersection of Henderson Lane and North Creek Road.

6.5 Request Speed Zone - Bundaleer Road

Introduction

It is proposed to undertake a speed zone review of Bundaleer Road to determine a suitable speed limit for the estate. To date there has been no formal signage installed with a reliance on the derestricted drive to conditions methodology.

Information

Bundaleer Road is a rural residential subdivision on the north-east area of the shire. A resident of Bundaleer Road is seeking a reduction in the speed limit to 50km/h or less and cites that there are a large number of recreational users that use the road on a daily basis.

The RMS is the governing authority of speed limits. The RMS would need to undertake a speed assessment of the area prior to erection of the speed zone signage.

It is proposed to ask the RMS to undertake a speed zone assessment of Bundaleer Road.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Committee request the RMS to undertake a speed zone assessment of Bundaleer Road.

6.6 Request Speed Zone Signage - Meridian Drive, Coolgardie

Introduction

It is proposed to undertake a speed zone review of Meridian Drive, Coolgardie to determine an appropriate rural residential speed limit for the estate. To date there has been no signage installed with reliance on the derestricted drive to conditions methodology.

Information

Meridian Drive is a rural residential subdivision in the southern Pacific Highway of the Shire, Coolgardie. A resident of Meridian Drive is seeking a speed zone review from the state default limit to a lesser more appropriate rural residential speed limit. The resident writes that there are differing speeds that vehicles travel Meridian Drive and would like to see a more uniform limit adopted (either 60km/h or 80km/h) and sign posted.

It is proposed to refer this item to the RMS to undertake a speed zone assessment of Meridian Drive.

The resident is also seeking the erection of curve advisory signage (W9-1 and W9-2) either side of the intersection at Meridian Drive and Gardie Place. This is because the road turns sharply and people get confused especially at night.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. That the Committee request the RMS to undertake a speed zone assessment of Meridian Drive
- 2. That the Committee recommend the erection of curve warning signage (W9-1 and W9-2) either side of the Meridian Drive Gardie Place intersection.

8.1 Back Channel Road Wardell

Introduction

The RMS has contacted Council with a request to provide information in relation to a speed review of Back Channel Road, Wardell.

Information

In response to this request, Metrocount data has been collated. A copy of this information is attached for the Committee.

The email from the RMS discusses centre line marking. To date the Council has not applied this marking due to the low vehicle volume which is typically around an ADT of 410 vehicles per day.

The accident history shows excessive speed as the primary reason for crashes at this location. The benefits of line marking need to be assessed against maintenance costs.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Committee receive and note the information in the above report.

- Through to Lismore


The previous arrangements have appeared to operate satisfactorily.
