5. Outstanding Business

(a) Update on Relocation of Markets to Lennox Head Cultural and Community Centre – Proposed Formation of Committee to Oversee Lake Ainsworth Management Plan

A Notice of Motion submitted to the December 2013 Ordinary meeting by Cr Cadwallader to form a Committee to oversee the implementation of the Lake Ainsworth Management Plan lapsed for want of a seconder.

(b) Bollards opposite Lennox Head Hotel – Confusion with Parking

Council's technical officers have inspected the site and observed it to be operating satisfactorily. The site will continue to be monitored and changes implemented where necessary in response to this monitoring.

c) Signage – off street parking adjacent to Lennox Head Surf Club

The signage as shown in the attached photos was installed following completion of the carpark.





d) Seating at Pat Morton Lookout

The Lennox Head Residents Association Coastcare Group have offered to assist in the maintenance of the wooden seats due to the servicing levels required for timber in this harsh coastal environment. Council staff have since inducted the group and are assisting them with materials and guidance.

(e) Landscaping – Park Lane

The gardens over summer had suffered from a lack of irrigation and maintenance due to staff servicing levels. The gardens have since been under restoration through the Community Participation Program. These volunteers help 2 hours every Thursday at the Community Centre. Progress is occurring through weed control, planting, mulching and watering.

(f) Irrigation System – Williams Reserve

Works were recently completed to reinstate the irrigation system at Williams Reserve that should assist the remediation of the field surface.

(g) Megan Crescent Reserve facilities

Staff have inspected the facilities twice and cannot detect the reported odour. Maintenance staff have not noted an issue on previous visits. Therefore it is suggested on the next occasion clubs experience an issue they immediately contact Council officers to arrange a site inspection.

6. Community Event Signage

Committee members will be aware that Council has made provision for a number of basic signage structures to be erected in prominent locations within the shire.

The structures are intended for use at no cost by organisers of community events which have been approved by the Council. Placement of promotional signage relating to the event on the structures may be organised by contacting Council's Events and Grants Support Officer, Ms Holly Archibald. Policy and guidelines relating to the use of the structures are available on Council's website.

An additional community event signage structure has recently been constructed on the corner of Tintenbar Road and George Street in Tintenbar. This brings the numbers of structures in the shire to 10.

7. Anzac Centenary Local Grants Funding Available

The Anzac Centenary Local Grants Program will assist and encourage communities across Australia to undertake their own Anzac Centenary projects that commemorate the service and sacrifice of Australian servicemen and women in the First World War. The Anzac Centenary Local Grants Program is a key element of the Australian Government's Anzac Centenary program through which funding of up to \$125,000 will be made available for each Federal Member of Parliament (MP) to support projects in their electorate commemorating the First World War. In the Page Electorate funding will be distributed evenly across the five regions at \$25,000 per region.

Types of projects eligible under this program include:

- public commemorative events, including the commemoration of important military anniversaries, enlistments and other First World War events that have had a significant impact on the local community;
- new First World War memorials or honour boards;
- the restoration of existing First World War memorials or honour boards;
- the preservation, interpretation and display of First World War wartime and military memorabilia and artefacts; and
- relevant school projects, such as research with a focus on military involvement and social impacts, and the products of research, e.g. written material, documentaries etc.

Who can apply:

- Community and ex-service organisations
- Schools and other educational institutions
- Museums and cultural institutions
- Local government authorities
- Other non-profit community organisations

The input of the local community is a key priority of this Program, and each Member of the House of Representatives (MP), and representatives of the local community selected by them, will provide key input into the assessment of proposals against this priority. A regional sub-committee has been formed in Ballina that will assess all applications from the Ballina local government area and make recommendations for funding.

A closing date for applications from the public to the Office of Kevin Hogan will be **Monday 14 April**, 2014. Applications will then be forwarded to the Ballina sub-committee for assessment. The local MP is responsible for submitting applications to the Department Veterans' Affairs by **Friday 30 May** 2014.

Additional funding opportunities include:

Department of Veteran's Affairs – Saluting their Service Commemorations Grant (small grants \$3,000 and \$4,000) – aims to support projects and activities that directly commemorate Australia's servicemen and women.

Department of Veteran's Affairs – Veteran and Community Grants (\$2,000 - \$50,000) - aims to maintain and improve the independence and quality of life of members of the veteran community.
