What you need to know when taking your own cup or containers to a café or restaurant



>> Why use reusable cups and containers?

- Reduce packaging waste
- Send less waste to landfill (coffee cups cannot be recycled)
- Reduce litter in the community
- Support sustainable living

Can I use a reusable cup or container at a food outlet?

Yes, legislation under the Food Act 2003 (NSW) or the Australian New Zealand Food Standards Code does not prohibit the use of reusable cups and containers.

The purpose of the Act is to ensure food for sale is both safe and suitable for human consumption.

Can I take leftovers home in my own container?

Yes, the Act or Code does not prevent a business accepting a customer's container for their leftovers.

Can a business decline my reusable container?

It is up to the business whether they accept containers brought in by customers or not.

What about safety and hygiene?

Make sure your cup or containers are clean, in good condition and of food-grade material.

Under the Food Standards Code, businesses can only use packaging material which is 'fit for its intended use' and is unlikely to cause contamination during or after the packaging process. It is not recommended to use non-food containers for food or drink purposes.

Small changes to your everyday activities can provide substantial benefits to the environment. Once positive habits are formed, sustainability becomes a way of living. Support businesses with a focus on sustainable practices and where possible eat in to use ceramic cups, foodware and cutlery. Only order what you need to reduce food waste.
